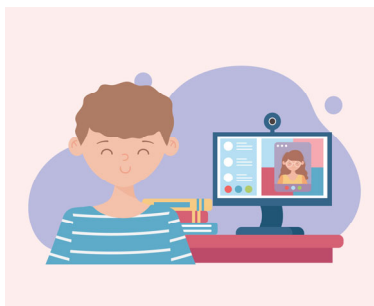

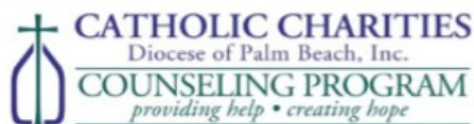

XXII domingo: Tener la inteligencia de Dios

No debería ofrecer dificultades aceptar que Dios, el Creador, es más inteligente que el hombre, la criatura. Sin embargo, en cuanto no entendemos algo, pensamos que o Dios no existe, o no se interesa por nosotros, o se ha equivocado. Esto lo pensamos especialmente cuando algo nos hace sufrir, cuando se presenta la Cruz con alguno de sus mil rostros: la enfermedad, la muerte, los problemas afectivos o los del trabajo. Deberíamos intentar tener la inteligencia de Dios, imitar al Señor, que no eligió el camino de lo fácil, del éxito, del milagro, para resolver todos los problemas y redimir a la humanidad, sino que escogió el camino de la Cruz.
